By bridging literature on gender expansive youth with the SJYD principles, the study offers insights crucial for communities striving for inclusive and equitable educational environments.





Practical Implementation in Community and School Settings

Local Level Actions



- Challenge oppressive power dynamics and redistribute power and agency.
- Foster mutual learning and connection between students and teachers.
- Encourage student self-organization and activism supported by adult allies.

Curriculum Integration

- Teachers become allies with TNB students, inviting their contributions to the curriculum.
- Avoid burdening TNB students as sole educators on gender issues.
- Promote TNB youth culture within educational contexts.

Grassroots policy change

- Utilize participatory action research to amplify the voices of TNB students.
- Integrate their suggestions to modify policies and promote critical consciousness.
- Implement inclusive policies such as for using formally the chosen nama, preferred pronouns, and gender-neutral restrooms

National Level Advocacy:



- Prioritize policies safeguarding LGBTQIA+ students and inclusive gender teachings.
- Emphasize the role of psychologists in promoting social justice and supporting TNB students within schools.
